

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Summer CALM 2021

CRPS is once again offering Summer CALM 2021 (Career and Life Management) in an immersive experiential manner. Students will take the course over 5 days and 4 nights, receiving a total of 6 credits for the course. Immersion in the 5-day course will take place at the Canadian Rockies Outdoor Learning Centre in Bow Valley Provincial Park and surrounding natural spaces, and provincial and national parks.

Students will take part in a number of learning activities including land and water wilderness navigation, meal planning and preparation, flat water canoe training on the confluence of the Bow and Kananaskis Rivers, hiking, rock climbing, horseback riding, and journaling. (*Please note that activities are subject to change without notice.)


Students will stay in bunks at the Outdoor Learning Centre that are equipped with bunk beds, hot showers and flush toilets. As part of meeting the curricular outcomes, students will plan and prepare all meals.

Registration for Summer CALM is now open. Due to the popularity of this program and the limited number of registrations accepted, it is recommended to register as soon as possible. For more information visit the CRPS website.

For students who do not want to partake in a face-to-face summer CALM program, an online program will be available through CRPS Summer School.


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
