  - Due to the recent extreme natural disasters in the past five to ten years (floods, fires) and the increasing frequency of such disasters insurance providers have assessed the province of Alberta at a higher risk level. Insurance industry experts knew there would be a trend that will develop where the insurance market in Alberta would change from the current soft market conditions to a hard market situation where insurance brokers would have to go to the open market to obtain coverage at a much higher rate for premiums. The insurance industry did not anticipate that the adjustment would happen so soon and so abruptly.
