509 PUBLIC GIFTS TO THE SCHOOL

Gifts, which may serve to enhance and extend the work of the school, may be received by the Division. It will be the general policy of the Division to direct those who desire to make contributions to consider equipment or services that are not likely to be acquired from public fund expenditures.

- 1. Tangible property contributed to the school becomes the property of the Division and is subject to the same controls and regulations that govern the use of other school-owned property.
- Contributions of property or services that may involve major costs for installation or maintenance, or initial or continuing financial commitments from school funds, will be presented by the Superintendent for Board consideration and approval during the annual budget process, if possible.
- 3. Any group planning to raise money for a gift to the school will first consult with the Principal and Superintendent regarding what gift should be made.
