Presently, we are reviewing how to further enhance our educational approach through STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics), but we are aware many other opportunities exist. Senior administration, staff and community representatives have begun preliminary discussions about what that might look like, keeping in mind, "What do our students need for the future?"
