BES Grade 8 Initiatives—Creative Solutions for Real-World Problems

The Board of Trustees were treated to an informative presentation by Banff Elementary School teacher Elissa Sunderland and student Kaiser Amin for the community initiative projects that the BES Grade 8 students developed. The students worked in groups according to each student's particular interest. The projects focused on: poverty, hunger, greenhouse gasses, inclusion, and community spirit and fostering friendships. Locally Developed Courses

Canadian Rockies School Division supports the local development of junior high school and senior high school courses that complement provincially authorized courses, to further develop and cultivate the unique interests and abilities of students, to foster educational improvement and excellence through innovation at the local level, and to meet the unique needs of a local community.

The Division also supports the acquisition of authorized courses from other jurisdictions deemed to be of benefit to its students. CRPS has acquired a number of these courses from other school divisions, with each course having a 4-year period of authorization. Once the 4 years has expired, CRPS has the option of reacquiring the course. Just a few of the courses being offered that require re-authorization at this time are Competencies in Math, Guitar, Leadership in the Arts, Learning Strategies,

Psychology-Advanced, Reading, Instrumental Jazz, and Technical Theatre

Learning Disruption Grant

The Learning Disruption Grant was provided to school divisions to offer targeted programming supporting reading, writing and numeracy skills for early learners whose learning was impacted by the pandemic. Learning assessments were completed to identify students who could benefit from this targeted programming. Additional staffing was put in place to provide this programming that was given above and beyond classroom learning. In the fall, the initial focus was on students in Grades 2 and 3. Targeted support for students in Grade 1 started in March. Subsequent reassessment showed significant student growth.

CRPS would like to express our sincere appreciation to the Rotary Club of Canmore for the donation of \$5,000 towards Sensory equipment at Exshaw School. These funds will provide therapeutic equipment with a variety of learning tools that allow students opportunities to selfregulate and engage in learning.
