Additional information

This fee includes one round trip transfers from/to the Calgary International Airport (YYC) and our regular monthly activities and all fees associated with the activity including transportation. Below are examples of activities we do with our students (one example per month):

September: student orientation for full year and fall term students (possible activities include hiking, paddling, team building, ropes course, and evening campfire under the stars)

October: Lake Louise sightseeing/hiking, disc golf

November: curling, shopping in Calgary

December: Christmas party with host families

January: ice skating, snowshoeing

February: student orientation for full year and spring term students (possible activities include team building, night-time hiking with headlamps, and singing around the campfire)

May: day trip to Drumheller visit Badlands/Royal Tyrell Museum), mountain biking

June: farewell party with host families that may include BBQ and white water

Full semester WILD program for grades 10-12 Get high school credits

Canoeing, skiing, snowshoeing, and backcountry camping! Our WILD Program is a lifetime opportunity. This full semester specialized leadership course is offered in a variety of locations throughout the beautiful Rocky Mountains and includes both classroom time and overnight trips. No other school division offers this unique type of training, instruction, and student development. 13 high school credit course on land, on snow and on water.

INCLUDED IN OUR WILD 15 PROGRAM:

- Water Experience 15 (4 days, 3 nights)
- Winter Travel 15 (4 5 days)
- High Ropes Course day
- Wilderness First Aid Skills
- Paddle Canada Waterfront, Canoeing Skills Certification
- The 4 and 5 day experiences are overnight trips with accommodation in lodge/cabin, tent, or shelter
- Meals, accommodations, transportation, and equipment & rentals

- Extensive experiential outings in various wilderness settings and seasons
- Development of character, leadership, interpersonal relationships
- Technical skills: canoeing, skiing, snowshoeing, and backcountry camping







SKI ACADEMY

The Canadian Rockies Ski Academy is an integrated ski and school program for students in grades 9-12, attending either BCHS or CCHS. The Academy provides an opportunity for international students to achieve athletic goals while still balancing educational demands. Held at the world famous Lake Louise ski resort, this program is sure to inspire students to their fullest potential.

This program is suitable for confident downhill skiers who are interested in developing their skill set

further. The Academy is not a racing program although ski racers will benefit and come out of this program as stronger and better skiers. The program is well tailored for someone looking to pursue a future career in the ski industry or earning additional income as a ski instructor.

INCLUDED IN OUR SKI ACADEMY:

- Full year: 44 lessons of coaching on snow
- One semester: 22 lessons of coaching on snow
- Lake Louise Ski Resort season pass
- Shuttle bus service to/from the ski resort
- A locker at the ski resort
- Ski Academy team jacket
- Instructors have achieved the CSIA or CASI level 3 teaching as a minimum standard. All instructors are able to teach all over the vast terrain Lake Louise has to offer

Learn to ski program

Canadian Rockies Public Schools is thrilled to partner with Lake Louise Snow School to offer this introductory ski program to international students who may have little or no skiing experience. This program is designed to safely guide a novice skier through 4 weeks of fun in a small group with the objective to provide sufficient skills to be able to safely ski down a green run and explore the Lake Louise Ski Resort.

The Ski Club program is offered at the start of winter season and at the beginning of second semester. Ski Club runs for four Sundays as follows:
