# **Position Summary**

The Occupational Therapist is a unique position within the Division that has been put into place to support the needs of students with foundational skills such as fine motor skills, gross motor skills, visual-perceptual skills, sensory skills, social-emotional skills and cognitive skills. School-based occupational therapy is designed to enhance the student's ability to fully access and be successful in the learning environment.

### Qualifications

- 1. Master's degree in Occupational Therapy or equivalent.
- 2. Ability to be registered with the Alberta College of Occupational Therapists (ACOT); continuing professional development and professional liability as per ACOT guidelines.
- 3. Previous pediatric experience working in private and/or school settings is an asset.
- 4. Good communication & interpersonal skills.

## **Duties and Responsibilities**

1. Administering formal and informal assessments, including screening of Kindergarten students to identify a need for further assessment and/or intervention.

- 2. Consult closely with teachers, educational and therapeutic assistants, therapists, social workers, specialists and parents who participate as part of each child's program planning team.
- 3. Complete assessment and treatment reports (year-end summaries, etc.) to share with parents, student learning teams and applicable professionals.
- 4. Providing on-site occupational therapy services to students.
- 5. Support students with sensory, physical, cognitive and psychosocial needs in Kindergarten through Grade 12.
- 6. Consult with multi-disciplinary teams including; Speech-Language Pathologist, Behavioral Specialist, Psychologist.
- 7. Provide universal, targeted and specialized interventions and strategies to support all students with increased independence and access to classroom activities.
- 8. Provide consultation to support occupational therapy intervention that can be supported at home.
- 9. Mentoring, supporting and providing professional development for Educational Assistants.
- 10. Maintaining a Professional Growth Plan.
