

New Four Year Plan to Drive CRPS' Budget Process

Canadian Rockies Public Schools (CRPS) Board of Trustees approved Year 4 of the division's 2021 - 2025 Four-Year Education Plan on Jan. 24, 2024. This plan was sculpted by performance insights from the division's 2022/23 Annual Education Results Report and extensive internal consultations since September 2023. CRPS' Education Leadership Team (ELT) was instrumental, first by identifying 15 priority actions last November to enhance divisional performance in health and wellness, engaged learning, and student supports. Subsequently, in a December workshop, the ELT refined the plan's strategies, opting for consolidation and elimination of actions now intrinsic to the division's operations or mandated by educational standards like the Teaching Effectiveness Framework and Teaching Quality Standard. The approved plan will drive CRPS' 2024 budget process, which will commence following the release of the province's funding framework manual this winter. CRPS Enables Culinary Chef to Earn Teaching Degree

CRPS recently received approval for their application to the Career and Technology Studies (CTS) Bridge-to-Teacher Certification Program. This innovative program, a collaborative effort by the government, the Alberta Teachers' Association, and post-secondary institutions, enables journey-certificated tradespeople to transition into teaching roles, particularly in CTS. It aims to enhance CTS opportunities for students by bringing industry expertise into classrooms.

Driven by her passion for Culinary Arts education, she is set to embark on a journey to complete her Bachelor of Education at the University of Alberta while teaching at a CRPS high school.
