

# Wim & Nancy Pauw Foundation Donation for 2025/26

Canadian Rockies Public Schools (CRPS) has received a significant donation from the Wim & Nancy Pauw Foundation for the 2025/26 school year. The total donation amount of \$1,100,000 (an increase of almost 10% from last vear) is intended to enhance educational and extracurricular opportunities for students across CRPS schools in the following areas: Athletics, Outdoor Pursuits, Experiential Outdoor Learning, Student Wellness and Wrap-Around Support Services, and Academics, with a focus on learning as well as reducing the financial burden on families.

### **CCHS Multipurpose Room Dedication**

Trustee Carol Picard served the students, staff and communities of Canadian Rockies Public Schools with dedication and distinction for over 15 years. #### **Advocacy Priorities**
